DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY :

The department began with offering B.Sc. general course in 1961 which was further upgraded for teaching Honours in Chemistry in 1967. The department is enriched with well-equipped laboratories and e-classrooms. Students of the department have also ranked in JAM and other All India Examinations.



DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY :

The department was established in 1978, which was upgraded to Honours level in 1996, and post-graduate status during 2003-04 with academic autonomy in 2004-05. The department is well equipped with laboratories for both UG and PG students. The departmental wall magazine is Life-o-Live.

DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY:

The Department of Zoology was established in 1996 and upgraded itself to post-graduate status with academic autonomy in 2009. The department has well facilitated laboratories and two digital e-classrooms. The teachers act as principal investigators in central and state-funded projects and provide guidance to research scholars pursuing their Ph.D degree. In 2016, the department has been awarded DBT BOOST II for three years for infra- structural upgradation of research laboratories.



DEPARTMENT OF GEOGRAPHY:

The department of Geography was established in the year 1996. It provides training in the practical modules of the course curriculum to help understand the natural environment, physical forces of nature and biodiversity. The laboratory cum store has a wide variety of instruments available for the students. The Maps section is a store house of a wide collection of topographical maps, aerial photographs and satellite images. The Department also has a modern survey instrument like 'Total Station'.

About Library (Transformation From Inception To Present): The Barasat Government College Library embarked on its journey in 1950 with a modest collection of just 50 books. Today, it boasts a comprehensive collection tailored to meet the needs of its users, including books, journals, and periodicals in both print and electronic format. Spanning an area of 4,000 square feet, the library offers home lending services, a reading room, and reference services, as well as PDF Books, E-Resource at Library WEB OPAC accessible through Library section of our website. As the cornerstone of all academic activities at the college, the Central Library plays a pivotal role in the teaching and learning processes of both undergraduate and postgraduate courses, as well as in research activities. It houses an impressive collection of around 87,846 books, including old and rare volumes, valuable reference materials, journals, educational CDs/DVDs, and countless e-books and e-journals. These resources are available to students, faculty members, State Aided College Teachers, research scholars, and staff members from various departments. Library services are efficiently managed using **KOHA**, an open-source library management software, with the database accessible remotely through Web OPAC (Online Public Access Catalogue). Additionally, the library subscribes to the **ONOS (One Nation One Subscription)** which provides country-wide access to international high-impact scholarly research articles and journal publications for all higher education institutions students, faculty, and researchers, allowing users to access a vast array of e-journals and e-books from different publishers remotely. The library also features an excellent reading room facility and each department of the college has its own seminar library. Special accommodations include a collection of Braille books to assist visually impaired users, and regular preservation efforts ensure the longevity of the library's collections.

Library Cards: The College library provides book lending KOHA ID (resembles students' College Id Card) to its students which enable them to borrow books from the library. Presently from the day one of receiving College Identity Card students can lend book from library through KOHA book circulation process using their KOHA ID.

Against one unique KOHA ID, number of books issue permitted is mentioned below:

Faculty Members: 30, State Aided College Teachers: 5, Staff Members: 10, UG Students: 2, PG Students: 1

Renewal of Cards: Students, moving to 2nd/3rd year degree classes, are required to renew their Library Cards.

Issue of Books: A degree student may borrow 2 books at a time, for a period of 15 days.

Overstay Fine: A student, keeping a book beyond 15 days without renewal, will be charged a fine. Details can be found on the back of the Library Card.

Our Library Foresight: The Central Library is really aiming to meet the needs of its patrons, especially Gen Z (chronically online, tech-fluent) students. Library is offering CCTV surveillance to enhance security, while free Wi-Fi, QR code based accessibility and e-book assistance show a commitment to modern technology and accessibility. Library automation likely streamlines processes, making resources more readily available to support today's learners effectively.

CHOICE OF COURSES

UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 54 credits (Table 1, 1A) or have secured 42 credits (Table 2) will be awarded a UG certificate **if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits or a 4-credit work-based learning/internship/apprenticeship** during the summer vacation of the first year. These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and **have secured 98 credits (Table 1, 1A) or have secured 84 credits (Table 2)** will be awarded the UG diploma **if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits or a 4-credit work-based learning/internship/apprenticeship** during the summer vacation of the second year. These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, **securing 142 credits (Table 1, 1A) which includes 4-credit of summer internship/apprenticeship.**

3-year Multidisciplinary UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year Multidisciplinary UG programme will be awarded UG Degree (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.) after successful completion of three years, **securing 130 credits (Table 2) which includes 4-credit of summer internship/apprenticeship.**

4-year UG Degree (Honours): Students who wish to undergo a 4-year UG programme (Honours) will be awarded UG degree (Honours) after successful completion of a four year degree programme with **182 credits (Table 1) which includes 4-credit of summer internship/apprenticeship.**

4-year UG Degree (Honours with Research): Students **who secure 75% marks and above in the first six semesters** and wish to undertake research at the undergraduate level can choose a research stream in the fourth year. The students **who secure 187 credits, including 15 credits from a research project/dissertation (Table 1A),** will be awarded UG Degree (Honours with Research).

ADMISSION

Admission to the above courses would be according to the merit of the applicants and availability of seats. Merit lists of candidates are published on the college Notice-board and the college website. Physical verification of documents and testimonials will be done after the commencement of classes.

Centralised admission through WBCAP started in the 2024-25 academic year. Merit list of candidates are published in the centralised admission portal maintained by the West Bengal State Council of Higher Education.
